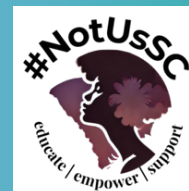

What is #NotUsSC?

#NotUsSC is a community-based maternal health initiative focused on protecting and supporting Black mothers and families across South Carolina.

Our work centers on three key areas:

Educate communities with clear, life-saving information

Empower individuals to speak up and advocate for their care

Support families during pregnancy, after birth, and beyond

Real change happens when **communities** are **informed, connected, and supported.**



Who can join?



Anyone who is passionate about supporting Black mothers and families is welcomed to apply. This includes: **community members, parents and caregivers, faith leaders & church members, beauticians, stylists & barbers, students, educators, business owners, public & community leaders, advocates & organizers.**

What is a Community Ambassador?



A Community Ambassador is a trusted person who connects #NotUsSC to their community.

They help us reach people, share maternal health information, and get resources into the spaces where they are needed most.

Ambassadors also help us create, review, and distribute materials, represent #NotUsSC at events, and connect us with local partners.

What Ambassadors Do?

Community Ambassadors connect #NotUsSC to their communities and help share and strengthen our work.

This may include:

Sharing information about #NotUsSC & maternal health

Providing feedback on materials & programs

Connecting #NotUsSC to trusted spaces & partners

Supporting outreach at local events

Representing #NotUsSC in your community



Time Commitment

This program is a one-year commitment.

Ambassadors will...

- Complete an orientation and training
- Attend meetings twice a month
- Stay involved in outreach and community efforts

Why it matters?

Black mothers still face **higher risks during pregnancy and after birth**, and many of these risks can be prevented with the right information and support.

Community Ambassadors help share trusted information so families can learn, act, and stay safe.

This work helps save lives.



Is this a paid role?

This is a **volunteer** role and is **not paid**.

Ambassadors will get training, resources, and the opportunity to support maternal health in their communities.
